Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors Courses

AP courses are college-level courses students can take in high school. Honors courses are also more challenging than regular classes, but not to the degree of AP courses. (For all honors courses except Pre-Calculus and Spanish 4, students enroll in the regular class but can get "Honors" designation and credit by doing a significant amount of additional work in that subject area.)

Both AP and Honors courses provide an excellent opportunity for students to prepare for college-level work and demonstrate their academic abilities to colleges. It also allows them to earn a higher GPA: when calculating the GPA for AP courses, the value is based on a 5.0 scale (A = 5.0, B = 4.0, C = 3.0), and when calculating the GPA for Honors courses, the value is based on a 4.5 scale (A = 4.5, B = 3.5, C = 2.5).

AP courses have the added benefit of preparing students for the AP Exams (administered each May). If students do well on an AP Exam, most colleges will give them college credit and/or exempt them from introductory coursework in that subject.

Prerequisites for AP courses:

- 1. A minimum overall GPA of 3.0 (B average).
- 2. The recommendation of previous teacher(s) in the subject area
- 3. Maintaining a semester grade of "C" or higher.

Dual Credit Courses

Similar to the AP Exams, dual credit eligible courses enable students to earn college credits while still in high school. For \$200 per course, Colorado Christian University will grant college credit for these courses (provided students earn a C or higher).
